***Disaster Recovery** - Ginger & Brent Salone coordinate CCUMC’s Early Response Teams. ERT’s are specially trained teams that offer assistance soon after the disaster strikes. They generally do clean-up work and tasks required to stop further damage from being done, e.g. putting tarps on damaged roofs. The Stewardship of Wellness

Why Wellness is a Matter of Stewardship

Finally, after sixty years of reading the Scriptures, it finally dawned on me why I have the concept that I do of wellness as a stewardship discipline. Reading the 13th chapter of Leviticus for the umpteenth time, it finally connected. Just as the barbers of not that many years ago served also as surgeons, the priests of Old Testament times were the arbiters of wellness. The chapter begins, *Leviticus 13:1 The LORD said to Moses and Aaron, 2 “When anyone has a swelling or a rash or a shiny spot on their skin that may be a defiling skin disease, they must be brought to Aaron the priest or to one of his sons who is a priest.* And that theme continues throughout the books of Moses. God assigned to the priests not just religious duties, but also the responsibility to monitor the state of wellness of His people.

As I think on it, that is the way it has been from the beginning. When God created the Garden of Eden and put Adam and Eve in it, He gave instructions to guard their wellness: *Genesis 2:15 The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it. 16 And the LORD God commanded the man, “You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; 17 but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat from it you will certainly die.”*

And looking ahead, that is the way it will be for eternity. The Bible concludes with *Revelation 22*, which begins with this description of Godly wellness: *1 Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, as clear as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb 2 down the middle of the great street of the city. On each side of the river stood the tree of life, bearing twelve crops of fruit, yielding its fruit every month. And the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. 3 No longer will there be any curse.*

I learned in geometry that two points determine a line, and three points determine a plane. On that basis, I believe that we can say that our God of Grace, our God Who is Love, desires not just our salvation and our close relationship with Him -- *He also desires our Wellness!* In coming months I hope to point out other passages of Scripture that support and expand on this belief.

NEW MINISTRIES

Sprouts At CCUMC — sprout v. , sprouted , sprouting , sprouts . v.intr.

To begin to grow; give off shoots or buds. To emerge and develop rapidly. It is our belief that every child is special with a combination of gifts and talents that makes him or her truly unique. Each child is a packet of seeds that have a great potential for sprouting and growing into something truly amazing if given the right, nurturing environment. Many Cedar Creek youngsters come from disadvantaged homes. Many come from homes that are not conducive for studying because of lack of space, lack of facilities, noise from siblings, etc. Some may not have any adult with the time available after school that can help them with their homework, science project, or just to practice. The Sprouts Program at CCUMC is a nondenominational program meant to help seeds germinate and grow: to reach their full potential by providing a safe, quiet place for children to do their homework and/or receive extra help with their studies under adult supervision.

Sprouts at CCUMC is a new ministry that will focus on helping kids reach their full potential. We'll be concentrating on reading, arithmetic, and science skills. All study material will be provided. We're starting out small, just two days a week (Tuesdays and Thursdays) and with just 4th graders from Cedar Creek Elementary School. The sessions will go from after school until 5 or 6PM. We plan on growing with the kids and expand the program to more days and more grades. To make this new program work, **we need you!** Can you read a newspaper? Balance a checkbook? Do you love kids? Then you got what it takes to become a master gardener and help kids sprout. You can sign up for as many sessions a month that your schedule will allow. We especially need bilingual volunteers.

STEPHEN MINISTRY

It's a great way for you to show how much you care!

November 11, 2011, is Veterans Day and in honor of all of our veterans who have fought and given their lives to preserve our freedoms and for their love of this country, I am proud to relay the following story of one hero who gave his life to save the lives of others during combat.

Mike Monsoor was born on April 5, 1981, and died on September 29, 2009. He was awarded the "Congressional Medal of Honor" for giving his life in Iraq, as he jumped on, and covered with his body, a live hand grenade, saving the lives of a large group of Navy Seals that was passing by!

During Mike Monsoor's funeral, at Ft. Rosecrans National Cemetery, in San Diego, California. The six pallbearers removed the rosewood casket from the hearse and lined up on each side of Mike Monsoor's casket, were his family members, friends, fellow sailors, and well-wishers. The column of people continued from the hearse, all the way to the grave site. What the group didn't know at the time was, every Navy Seal (45 to be exact) that Mike Monsoor saved that day was scattered through-out the column!

As the pallbearers carried the rosewood casket down the column of people to the grave side, the column would collapse.. which formed a group of people that followed behind.

Every time the rosewood casket passed a Navy Seal, he would remove his gold trident pin from his uniform, and slap it down hard, causing the gold trident pin to embed itself into the top of the wooden casket! Then the Navy Seal would step back from the column, and salute!

Now for those, who don't know what a trident pin is, here is the definition!

After one completes the basic Navy Seals program which lasts for three weeks, and is followed by seal qualification training, which is 15 more weeks of training, necessary to continue improving basic skills and to learn new tactics and techniques, required for an assignment to a Navy Seal platoon. After successful completion, trainees are given their naval enlisted code, and are awarded the Navy Seal trident pin. With this gold pin they are now officially Navy Seals!

It was said, that you could hear each of the 45 slaps from across the cemetery! By the time the rosewood casket reached the grave site, it looked as though it had a gold inlay from the 45 trident pins that lined the top!



This was a fitting end to an eternal send-off for a warrior hero! This should have been front-page news but today it is too often not! We all need to remember the heroes who have given their lives so that we can live in freedom, the heroes who fought for this country and returned to relay the stories of heroes whose names we will never know and to the heroes of today who are currently fighting for this country at home and on foreign soil. Let us all fly the American flag on November 11, 2011 and every day of the year for all of these heroes. And, last but not least, be sure to thank every veteran and every enlisted G.I. currently serving this country you meet for the sacrifices they have made in the past and the sacrifices they are making for us every day today.

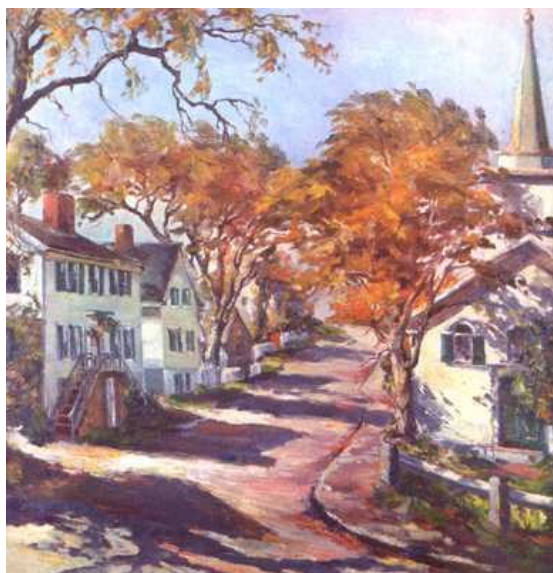

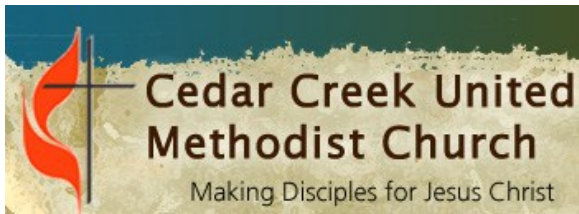
