PLEASE JOIN US FOR a Taizé Service. This is a quiet, candlelit service of prayer, meditation and song.

Second Sundays in the Chapel at 6:30. Due to Mother's Day on May 8, there will be no Taize Service. The next Taize Service will be on Sunday, June 12.

The Taizé service began in France and has been adopted and adapted across the world as Christian communities found the quiet atmosphere of such a service to be an enhancement and benefit to their own practices. Each service is unique in its own right, depending on the community hosting. The use of short verse songs, contemplative prayer and silence encourages the participants to quiet their hearts and minds and enter into a centered, thoughtful focus on God.

This is a wonderful opportunity at our church to enter into a quiet, contemplative time with the Lord.

If you find yourself surrounded by noise, busyness and obligations, allow this time to be a gift you give yourself and God.

Let me begin by sharing **one** of my favorite scripture passages: Philippians 4: Don't fret or worry. Instead of worrying, pray. Let petitions and praises shape your worries into prayers, letting God know your concerns. Before you it, a sense of God's wholeness, everything coming together for good, will come and settle you down. It's wonderful what happens when Christ displaces worry at the center of your life.

Summing it all up, friends, I'd say you'll do best by filling your minds and meditating on things true, noble, reputable, authentic, compelling, gracious – the best – not the worst; the beautiful-not the ugly; things to praise- not things to curse. ...Do that, and God, who makes every thing work together, will work you into his most excellent harmonies. (from The Message)

One of the easiest things for me to say is "hello!" The hardest is say "good-bye." May 31st will end my four year tenure as your associate pastor. I am going to either take a medical retirement or will take an incapacity leave (just means I not able to perform the regular duties of a full time pastor (full or part time) for at least 6 months).

I will preach on May 15th and June 5th. My appointment among you will officially end on June 11th following annual conference.

I have learned much as I have lived and served among you. It is an experience that I will treasure for the rest of my life. It has been such a blessing to me to see how as the body of Christ you have reached out to the sick, worked with the needy, and have tried to set the prisoners (literally and figuratively) free. That was part of Jesus' mission while on earth.

As the body of Christ, you have supported my ideas, encouraged me to step outside my comfort zone, helped me as I went through covenant connection. You have loved me, counseled me, and consoled me as only YOU can do. Thank you!

Even as I say good bye as your associate pastor, I anticipate being received among you as a member of this congregation and we learn to serve God together in new ways. After a sabbatical of 3-4 months, I will return to worship with you in the fall. Roy and I will continue to make our home in Cedar Creek. Our mailing address and my cell phone number will remain unchanged. I will be glad to visit with any of you after my sabbatical.

In closing, I would like to share a poem that my Mom gave me years ago:

Sadly, CCE is "86% economically disadvantaged". Our continued effort on the school's behalf helps not only the school administrators and educators, but also the children and their families. The needs are many and your donations are sought, and greatly appreciated. The most needed items are listed below:

Mentors—School Supplies—New undies, sizes 4 – 14, girls and boys—Gently used children's clothing, clean

***Disaster Recovery** - Ginger & Brent Salone coordinate CCUMC's Early Response Teams. ERT's are specially trained teams that offer assistance soon after the disaster strikes. They generally do clean-up work and tasks required to stop further damage from being done, e.g. putting tarps on damaged roofs. They might do minor repairs that help make homes habitable, but they do not do extensive repairs or reconstruction (that is the job for Long Term Recovery). In 2008, Early Response teams from the Southwest Texas Conference responded during Hurricane Dolly in our conference and during Hurricane Ike in the Texas Conference. The Stewardship of Wellness

The Promises of God

Exodus 15:26 And He said, "If you will give earnest heed to the voice of the LORD your God, and do what is right in His sight, and give ear to His commandments, and keep all His statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you which I have put on the Egyptians; for I, the LORD, am your healer."

Would that that verse applied to us, here now! It would be so simple in concept – all I have to do is listen to the Lord and obey, and I’ll never get sick! What could be easier?

But as we look at the entirety of Scripture, it is clear that that simple view is just too simple. First, that was a specific promise to a specific people for a specific situation. God was leading His chosen people out of slavery toward the Promised Land, a land flowing with milk and honey. It was not addressed to us in the here and now.

Second, if the Chosen People could not live by that simple “if ... then” promise, what makes us think that we would be able to? Most of us have all the challenge we can handle to live by the much easier burden of the Christian walk, and that with the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit who was not available in those days.

If not a literal application of that verse to my life today, what can I learn from Exodus 15:26? Now comes the Faith part: I believe that much of what God taught through Moses and through the record of early mankind still applies to us, here and now, without regard for spiritual practice. I believe that God created humans to live forever, but sin caused God to abandon that plan. But that did not change the original design, that God created humans to eat only plants; it was only after the flood that animal flesh was added to the menu. I believe that the dietary laws laid down in the books of Moses were based on God’s knowledge of what was harmful to us, and prohibitions against eating certain foods will, as a general statement, help up avoid harmful practices even today.

As United Methodists, we claim our heritage with the early Methodist movement begun by John Wesley and others in 18th century England. It is estimated that in his lifetime, Wesley traveled 250,000 miles on foot or on horseback to deliver 30,000 sermons. When Methodists came to America, traveling ministers were sent out to preach in the new frontier. These preachers became known as Circuit Riders because of their travel on routes between town churches. Some preached in brush arbors or in outdoor camp settings in the early 1800s.

In the history of Cedar Creek United Methodist Church, it is recorded that a circuit-riding Methodist minister gathered with local folks to conduct outdoor worship on Cedar Creek. We believe that this site may be near the old creek bridge which existed on the land now home to the Cedar Creek Park. We honor that early ministry in our area on May 22nd, by conducting one combined worship service in an outdoor setting at Cedar Creek Park pavilion. Please join us in celebrating our Wesleyan heritage and the importance of early circuit riders of our Methodist movement.

Bring a blanket or folding chair, bring your basket lunch, bring a friend – come and worship with us outdoors on May 22nd at Cedar Creek Park.

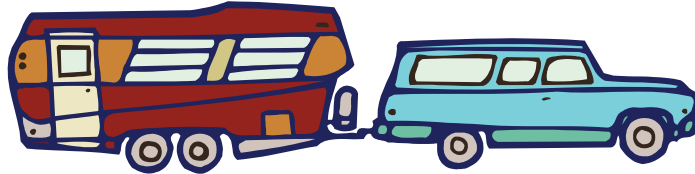

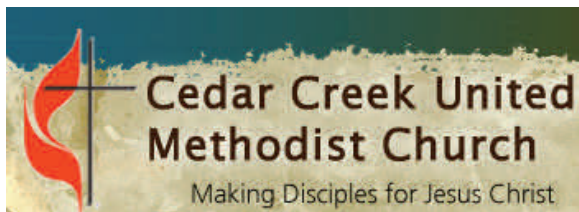
