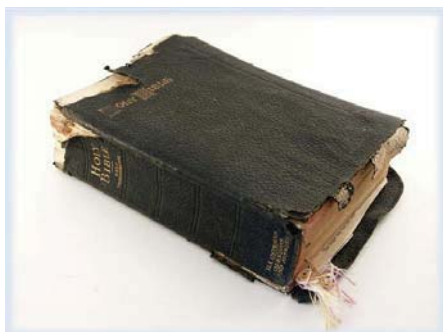

BROWN BAG BEGINS NEW STUDY

Members of the Brown Bag Bible Study group have just begun a new study "He Heard Their Cry" which focuses on the Israelites' captivity in Egypt and their deliverance from that captivity. The study is part of the Focus on the Family "That the World May Know" video series. Each video session features pastor/teacher/historian Ray Vander Laan at sights in Egypt and at the Red Sea as he discusses the culture and customs that shaped the Israelites as God led them from captivity.

If you've never experienced a Vander Laan led study, this is a good place to start. Knowledge of the customs and culture of the time leads to a better understanding of God's word. Outreach, June 2011

In Nehemiah 8:10, Nehemiah is teaching the Law to the people and he says “Go and enjoy good food and sweet drinks, send some to people who have none, because today is a holy day to the Lord”. Nehemiah and Ezra were teaching the people of God, and giving them the tools they needed to reclaim their legacy as God’s chosen people. This passage speaks to us of the law of love, the only law we, as Christians, really need . . . to love our neighbor as ourselves.

Fritz Ridenour, in his book “How to Be a Christian Without Being Religious”, says “The Christian is not a bystander in his society, he is in the thick of the battle for justice, morality and what is right . . . the law of love goes beyond justice, seeking the positive of doing good to others. The law of love, this is the only law a Christian needs.”

No, you should not run right out to the local law authorities and tell them you don’t need to obey the law of the land any more, that is not the point I am trying to make here . . . my point is, love is our guidance. God’s love for us. In turn, we share that love with each other and our neighbors. When we reach out in love, all things are possible, and God responds generously to help us meet the needs that we encounter each day, in our lives and in the lives of our friends and neighbors.

***Disaster Recovery** - Ginger & Brent Salone coordinate CCUMC’s Early Response Teams. ERT’s are specially trained teams that offer assistance soon after the disaster strikes. They generally do clean-up work and tasks required to stop further damage from being done, e.g. putting tarps on damaged roofs. They might do minor repairs that help make homes habitable, but they do not do extensive repairs or reconstruction (that is the job for Long Term Recovery). In 2008, Early Response teams from the Southwest Texas Conference responded during Hurricane Dolly in our conference and during Hurricane Ike in the Texas Conference. In 2010, ERTs assisted in the flooded areas of Central Texas. The Stewardship of Wellness

The Need for God

Psalm 38:1-7

***O LORD, rebuke me not in Your wrath, And chasten me not in Your burning anger.
For Your arrows have sunk deep into me, And Your hand has pressed down on me.
There is no soundness in my flesh because of Your indignation; There is no health in my bones because of my sin.
For my iniquities are gone over my head; As a heavy burden they weigh too much for me.
My wounds grow foul and fester Because of my folly.
I am bent over and greatly bowed down; I go mourning all day long.
For my loins are filled with burning, And there is no soundness in my flesh.***

This psalm of David shows the effect on his health of his offense against the Lord. David had sinned (don’t we all!?) and as recognizing his need for forgiveness and reconciliation with God.

Please do not misunderstand me: I am **not** saying that if someone is sick, it means that he has sinned. What I am suggesting is that we can do everything else perfectly for wellness, but if we ignore our relationship with the Lord, our wellness may suffer. Remember (or look up) my earlier article on The Wheel of Wellness (October 29, 2007 at <http://wellnessismyconcern.blogspot.com>): one of the principal factors affecting our wellness is SPIRITUAL LIFE -- knowing God, saved by grace for good work, true to being created in His image.

It is always appropriate to study the scriptures. But what I suggest is that if you have done everything else that you can find to do and you still suffer wellness concerns, confer with a trusted Christian friend (that can include a pastor or other church leader) and examine yourself. Perhaps what is needed is a good cleansing of your relationship with our Lord and Savior. And it is never out of order to ask for prayer for wellness, whether among Christian friends or, more formally, anointing with oil or the healing touch of hands.

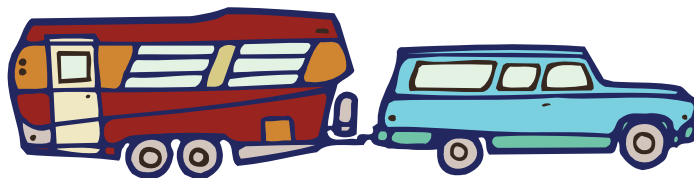

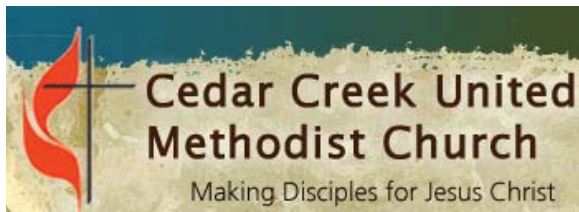
